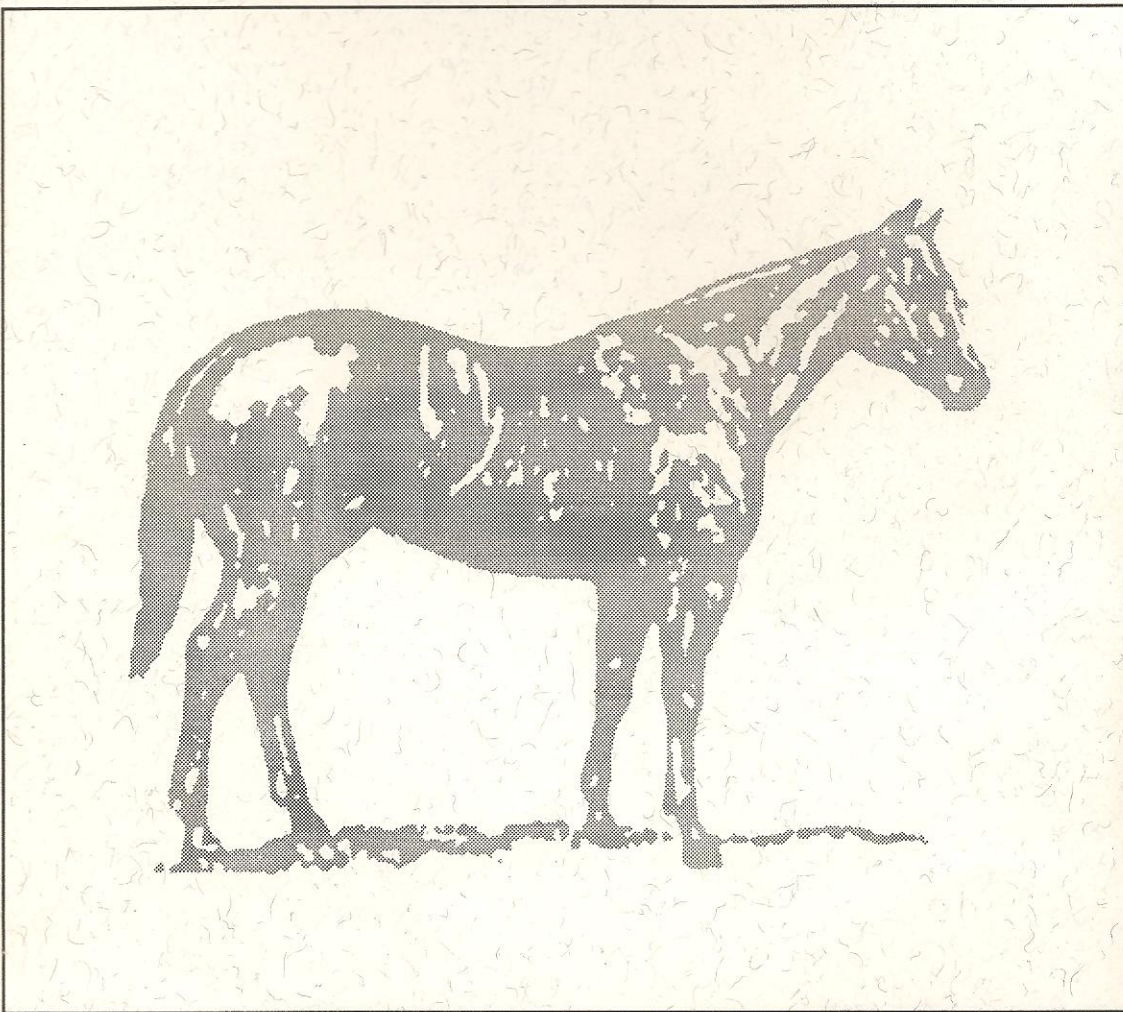

Laura Fisher has been selected by A.Q.H.A. to serve on the Amateur Committee. Dorvan Solberg will continue to serve on the Marketing / Promotions Committee.

A.Q.H.A. sends updates to the Board of Directors after each Executive Committee Meeting. This allows the A.Q.H.A. Directors to be kept up to date on all aspects of A.Q.H.A.'s Rules and Regulation changes.

If you have any questions regarding the Amateur Committee or the Marketing / Promotions Committee, please contact Laura or Dorvan. If there is a specific area of AQHA that you are interested in, please let us know, and we will contact one of the committee members that deal with that area.

Another item to mention is the H.R. 1215 Bill that passed the U.S. House of Representatives and is coming up for vote in the U.S. Senate. This bill includes tax changes that would benefit horse owners and breeders.

The H.R. 1215 Bill would:

1. Provide a 50% cut in capital gains for individuals.
2. Increase the expense deduction from \$17,500.00 to \$35,000.00 more than four years.
3. Permit the taxpayer to increase the basis in assets to reflect the impact of inflation.
4. Increase the estate and gift tax from \$600,000.00 to \$750,000.00.
5. Liberalize the deduction for home office expenses.

Board of Directors Meeting

April 28, 1995

Valley City, ND

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota Quarter Horse Association met at the Valley City Winter Show Building on April 28, 1995. Members present: Laura Fisher, president, Al Rickel, vice president, Scott Flach, Kevin Vesey, Steve Rothfork, Kevin Kasprick, Rocky Skarsgard. Absent: Ivan Susag, Karl Grefsrud.

Scott read the minutes from the last meeting. A motion was made and seconded (Kevin K. Scott) to approve the minutes.

There was discussion about the letter Beauclair and Skarsgards sent to AQHA members in North Dakota. The letter was written and paid for by Michelle Beauclair and the Skarsgards upon board request. The purpose of it was to tell about the national convention. Laura did not feel the letter should have gone out without board approval and contacted AQHA to determine their policy on it. Because AQHA's special bulk rate was used and unauthorized expense. The Board agreed that the intention of the letter was good, but would like any future correspondence that mentions NDQHA to be approved by the Board before mailing.

Laura discussed the wages for the show staff. The new Board members reviewed the contracts that were sent out. A motion was made and seconded (Al, Kevin V.) to approve the contracts.

NEWLETTER:

Laura was contacted by the Northern Horse Review magazine and the Wrangler newspaper. They are both interested in becoming the NDQHA official publication. Discussion was held on the pros and cons of not having our own Newsletter. All NDQHA members should have received a complimentary copy of the Northern Horse Review. Laura will put an article in the Newsletter asking for member comments on it. A motion was made and seconded (Rocky, Al) to table further discussion until the next meeting.

The financial condition of the Newsletter and ways to cut expenses were discussed. Laura felt that publishing point standings rather than show results would reduce expenses significantly. A motion was made and seconded (Kevin K., Laura) to not publish the show results in the Newsletter but to instead list the point standings.

David Fisher will contact Susan Copeland about NDQHA publications.

COMPUTER:

Al mentioned that Judy Erickson had checked into computer programs for the shows. There was further discussion on whether or not the association should purchase a computer or ask that the show management have their own. A motion was made and seconded (Laura, Steve) to have Scott, Kevin and Rocky check into prices on new and used computers. Questions were raised as to how it would be paid for. Ideas suggested were, fund raisers, short term loan, or asking the Amateur and Youth Association to help pay for it. Jackie will check into insurance costs for a computer.

FURTURITY:

Rocky had sent the Directors a copy of Futurity rules for their review and comments. Laura had added a few rules to the list and thought that the combined list of rules was more clearly defined and there would be less confusion than in previous years. A motion was made and seconded (Kevin K., Al) to add a \$20.00 penalty for all NSF checks. A motion was made and seconded (Laura, Scott) that, since Mary Rothfork has resigned, Rocky continue as Futurity Secretary and will look for help with fund raising, sponsorships, and donations.

Kevin V. and Kevin K. will check into prices for a saddle for the 2 year old Pleasure Futurity. Jackie will talk to the Mon-Dak Quarter Horse Association board members to see if they would be willing to help sponsor the Futurity. Kevin K. and Steve will ask the Amateur association if they will put added-money into the non-pro classes. Steve will organize a futurity feed for the Three Star I show.

A motion was made and seconded (Laura, Kevin K.) to add a Yearling Lounge-Line class to the Futurity.

The futurity checks will be mailed out to the winners within two weeks.

AJQHA WORLD SHOW:

A motion was made and seconded (Laura, Kevin V.) that Al send a letter to Tami Dietrich and Kelly Durick in regards to their letter asking to represent ND and the AJQHA World Show.

YEAR-END QUALIFICATIONS:

A motion was made and seconded (Laura, Al) that the Board members review the suggestions for year-end qualifications written by Myra Johnson and write comments on them. The comments or suggestions will be reviewed at the next meeting.

TEAM PENNING:

Laura mentioned that there will not be Team Penning at Three Star II due to scheduling problems.

TREASURES REPORT:

The Open Association currently has a balance of \$2399.31. The balance in the Amateur association is \$4018.20 and the Youth association is \$3362.18. Insurance for the Open and Amateur shows has been purchased. The tax return for the Association has been completed and mailed to the IRS.

Kevin K. Motioned to adjourn the meeting. Rocky seconded and all approved.

The NDAQHA General Membership Meeting

was held

January 14, 1995 at the Doublewood Inn, Fargo, ND

Minutes from the amateur meeting which was held in October, were read by secretary Teresa Kasprick and were motioned to be accepted and seconded by Myra Johnson. The treasurers report was given with a balance of \$4,591.54 in the account. It was mentioned that \$630.00 be added to our balance, \$500.00 received from Fisher Industries and \$130.00 from a plane ticket from a frequent flyer ticket, giving us a balance of \$4,597.84 Myra Johnson moved to accept this report and Doreen Swenson seconded it.

The Show Committee consisting of Lyle Johnson and Gary Heier reported on their progress. Lyle reported on our Amateur State Fair pre-show at Minot. The amateurs would be in charge Thursday and Friday, with Saturday being the State Fairs day and also being double judged. The NDAQHA will receive stall dollars from the Thursday show, but we would not have the expense of the arena, announcer, or gate person. At the 1994 show, were charged \$184.00 for Canadian Par. It was motioned that we do not want to accept their money at par, and Lyle seconded it. It was voted on and passed. In 1995, we will not accept Canadian money at par and this will be printed on all Minot flyers and information. Canadians should please write on their checks, "American Funds", or checks will be returned. Motion by Lynna Grefsrud, seconded by Vicki Kemmer, Gary reported on he Bismarck Show. The Bismarck Horse Club decided not to put on a 1995 show, so also the NDAQHA will not be putting one on. Everyone should be commended on all of their work at both shows.

Rocky Skarsgard asked if we would be interested in sponsoring a Williston Show together with the Mon/Dak Association. The NDAQHA decided not to, for the fact of our Minot and Bismarck shows.

The Awards Committee consisting of Phyllis Susag, Doreen Swenson and Lynna Grefsrud reported cash will be given out this year as the award computer information was not given to the point tabulator, which in turn, made this job very difficult and literally impossible. We needed to get definite state points from AQHA and the awards committee did not notice any problems until December, so they were running out of time. The Committee was short one award and also \$40.00 for the award Teresa Kasprick motioned to give the Awards Committee the \$40.00 and this was seconded by the membership passed.

A big thank you goes out to Sharon Erickson and the others who helped tabulate the points. Karl Grefsrud mentioned that there could be a thought on having a sub committee to help with tabulations. The paperwork that is required by AQHA, should also be required by the NDAQHA. Doreen Swenson motioned that we have a sub committee made up of two or more people and Todd Izler seconded it. Doreen Swenson, Sharon Erickson, Myra Johnson, and Lynna Grefsrud will be this committee.

Lyle Johnson brought up the idea of computer software to keep track of these points for tabulations. We would need to invest in computer software and also a computer. The NDQHA show secretary would need to be willing to

learn how to use it or to provide someone who would. Gary Heier motioned to make a recommendation to the NDQHA that they consider software and/or hardware for the shows, and that the amateurs help out with the expense. Deb Almeida seconded it. Motion was carried.

The nominations committee consisting of Gary Heier and Lynna Grefsrud reported. We have two board of directors positions to fill. Nominations are Mary Rothfork, Deb Alameida, and Kelly Bernhardson. Mary Rothfork and Deb Almeida will be out new board of directors.

Michelle Beauclair reported on membership. She would like to send out welcome cards to new members and thank you's to new exhibitors.

No changes were seen to be made for the Rules and Guidelines Committee.

As far as Futurity reports, we are going to wait until general membership of the NDQHA to hear more about the upcoming 1995 futurity.

The Finance Committee reported on receiving of bills. The Amateur secretary must receive all bills to approve before they are sent on the NDQHA secretary to be paid. Also, we will be giving Jackie a gift of appreciation for all of her organization and help she's given. She will receive this at the awards banquet.

Miscellaneous which was discussed included the sweatshirts which were to be designed. Kim Fordham and Teresa Kasprick are still taking all ideas and suggestions as far as logo's. Please feel free to talk to them.

The Sportsmanship Award was voted on by general membership at the amateur meeting and will be given out tonight at the awards banquet. Congratulations to Michelle Beauclair, you are so well deserving.

New ideas were mentioned concerning our Amateur Minot Show. We will have \$3000.00 in sponsorships, and RCC Sponsorship, and a two horse trailer give away, and a flyer will be sent out to surrounding states. Many people have volunteered to go out and get donations. A big thanks to all! Vera motioned to give directors chairs over the two days for the Open, Amateur and Youth All-arounds Lyle Johnson seconded it.

Also, a monogrammed nylon sheet will given to the Hi-point Halter Horse in the Open Amateur and Youth Classes over the two days. These have been donated by Town and Country Supply of Oakes, owned by the Kranzlers and , also a donation was received from Skarsgard Quarter Horses, owned by Rocky and Jackie. Thanks very much!

More will be discussed at the future meeting regarding our Minot Amateur State Fair Pre-show and the October futurity. Doreen Swenson motioned to adjourn with Kevin Kasprick seconding it.

NDQHA '95 FUTURITY and THREE STAR III QUARTER HORSE SHOW

October 6, 7, 8
Valley City, North Dakota



GENERAL RULES:

1. The NDQHA Futurity is open to AQHA registered horses, or in the case of weanlings, eligible to be registered. OWNERS and EXHIBITORS must be members in good standing of NDQHA.
2. The judging for the Futurity will be held in conjunction with the NDQHA Three Star III show at the Valley City Winter Show Arena. All entrants must participate in the corresponding AQHA class, and all AQHA rules shall apply. In the case of a tie, one of the three judges will be designated as the tie breaker prior to the start of showing.
3. Official postmark will determine date of entry (nomination) and all sustaining payments. All late payments not accompanied by the corresponding late fee of \$.50/day will be considered partial payments, and continue to accumulate late charges until paid in full. Please don't ask to be the exception.
4. No changes or substitutions of horses will be allowed. There will be NO REFUNDS for canceled entries.
5. Owners are expected to notify the Futurity secretary of any new information such as; gelding, name, sale, etc. Registration papers must match the horse exactly, and photocopies of both sides of the registration papers must accompany the final payment. For weanlings, proof of eligibility to register is sufficient.
6. Halter futurity entries will be placed with the combined score of the three days, placing all futurity entrants each day.
7. Performance futurity & maturity entries will pay 1/3 to each go-round. Total points of three shows will determine overall winners, with NDQHA point system to be used. Timed events will be fastest time of the three shows overall.
8. Additional two-year old pleasure class rules on entry form.
9. Payout will occur as soon as all entrant records are verified and tabulated. Entry payments include any drug testing fees which may occur.
10. PAYBACK SCHEDULE - Payback will be 100% of money allocated to the futurity through entry fees, added money and donations - less office charges. Payback will be based on number of futurity horses entered per class as described below:
 - ★ 1 horse class - 100%
 - ★ 2 horse class - 60%, 40%
 - ★ 3-5 horses in a class - top three places - 45%, 35%, 20%
 - ★ 6-9 horses in a class - top four places - 40%, 30%, 20%, 10%
 - ★ 10-14 horses in a class - top five places - 30%, 25%, 20%, 15%, 10%
 - ★ 15 or more horses in a class - top seven - 30%, 25%, 20%, 12.5%, 7.5%, 5%

1. All bits will be inspected by two (2) members of the Futurity Committee as the horses enter the class.
2. All horses will be shown in a "snaffle" bit or bosal. A snaffle bit is defined as "smooth ring type with a broken mouthpiece at least 3/8" in diameter with no shanks. Ring, D-ring, egg butt snaffles are all permitted, but the outside rings are not to exceed 4" in diameter. Photographs of acceptable bits will be published in the NDQHA Newsletter.
3. The Futurity Inspectors will have final approval of all questionable bits.
4. Riders may be asked to drop bridles or back at the option of the judges.
5. Horses will be asked to perform as in any other class, but the riders must "two hand" the horses.
6. No martingales or tie downs. No bosals or cavessonns will be permitted under the snaffles or bridles.

All NSF checks will be charged a \$20.00 service charge. Any NSF checks will result in cancellation of the entry, unless a money order or certified check is received within seven days of notice by secretary.

The NDQHA membership must be paid at time of nomination. All owners and exhibitors must be members in good standing of NDQHA and AQHA.

NDQHA and the Futurity committee will not be held responsible for any loss or damage to horses, equipment, or vehicles during the futurity. Each exhibitor is responsible for his own, and releases NDQHA and the Futurity committee of any liability.

Horses nominated for the Futurity and subsequently sold remain eligible if the new owners join NDQHA; or are currently members. All sustaining payments, including late charges, must be paid.



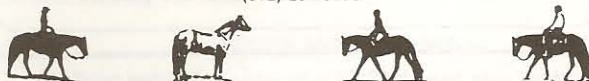

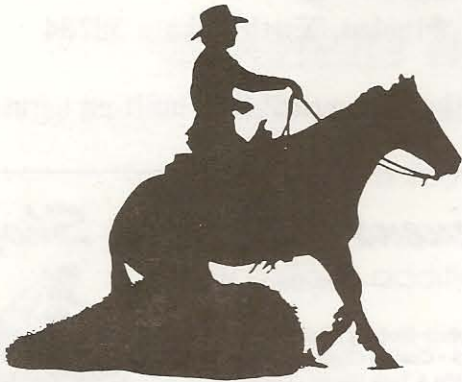

NDQHA SHOW RULES

Member Award Eligibility

1. To be eligible to compete for year-end awards, one must be current paid-up member of NDQHA. Letters of intent will no longer be required.
2. Points will begin to be tabulated from the date the membership is paid.

Show Approval

Points will be counted only for AQHA approved shows within the borders of North Dakota and which have, also, received approval from NDQHA. To be approved by NDQHA the show committee must send a complete show schedule plus approval fee to the NDQHA secretary 90 days prior to the show date to allow time for publication in the Newsletter.

Class Approval and Eligibility

1. Only AQHA approved classes, judged and administered according to AQHA rules, will be tabulated.
2. All AQHA classes as listed in the Official Handbook of AQHA will be eligible for year-end awards, providing the class has been offered a minimum of 10 times throughout the show year. Western pleasure will be divided into junior and senior divisions.

Horse Eligibility

1. Points will be accumulated only for horses shown under ownership of eligible NDQHA members in NDQHA approved shows. In case of multiple ownerships, at least one owner or partner must be a NDQHA member.
2. Points accumulated by a horse owned by an ineligible person cannot be transferred when/if the horse is sold to an eligible member as a result of subsequent sales, and points accumulated by a horse owned by an eligible member cannot be transferred when/if the horse is sold to an ineligible person. However, points will not be lost when a horse is transferred from one eligible member to another eligible member. This does not apply to youth or amateur classes.
3. Points will be tabulated only in the class so named and cannot be transferred to another class, eg. when a stallion is gelded, his points as a stallion cannot be transferred to the gelding class.

Point System

1. Halter & Performance Classes

Contestants placing in the top six of each class will be given a point for each for each exhibitor placing below them, plus one point not to exceed 6 points for first place. Points are to be calculated through sixth place. Example: In a class of six or more horses, the first place contestant receives six points, the second place receives five points, and so on down through sixth place. In a class of four entries, the first place contestant receives four points, the second place three points, etc.

2. High Point Halter Horses

Points for High Point Halter Horses will be tabulated as follows:

Grand Champion horses will receive one more point than any other horse one year or older in its sex division not to exceed seven points. The Reserve Champion horse will receive one less point than the Grand Champion horse. Example: If the Grand Champion stallion received 3 points for winning his class, and the first place stallion in another class won six points, then the Grand Champion stallion would receive one more point than that stallion for a total of 7 points. Or, if the Grand Champion stallion received 3 points for being first in his class, and no other stallion received more than 2 points in his class, then no additional points will be awarded to the Grand Champion stallion.

Awards

1. In order to receive an award, a horse must be shown a minimum of 10 times in a given class.
2. Awards will be given for first and second place winners of all eligible classes. Recognition will be given for 3rd and 4th place.
3. Ties for first and second place will be broken by:
 - a. the horse that participates in the most shows
 - b. the horse that places above the most entries

4. In addition to the first and second place award for each eligible class, the following awards will be made:

Grand Champion and Reserve halter stallion
Grand Champion and Reserve halter mare
Grand Champion and Reserve halter gelding
All Around Junior age horse, halter & performance points will be counted.
All Around Senior age horse, halter & performance points will be counted.

NORTH DAKOTA AMATEUR QUARTER HORSE AWARDS

NDAQHA awards will be given to Amateur exhibitors who are paid-up members of NDQHA and NDAQHA. Rules for Amateur awards will be the same as those in the Show Rules listed above.

Awards will be given for first through fourth place of each eligible class.

Additional Amateur Awards

All-Around and Reserve All-Around Amateur, halter and performance points will be counted.

All-Around Novice Amateur and Reserve Novice Amateur, novice amateur performance points will be counted.

NORTH DAKOTA YOUTH QUARTER HORSE AWARDS

NDJQHA awards will be given to Youth exhibitors who are paid-up members of NDJQHA, and NDQHA, or whose family has a paid-up membership with NDQHA. Rules for Youth awards will be the same as those in the Show Rules listed above with the following addition: In order for a Youth to be eligible for year-end awards, he/she must show in a minimum of 10 shows throughout show year.

Award will be given for first through fourth place of each eligible class.

Walk-Trot Class - Eligibility for NDQHA sponsored shows - the contestant must be 11 years of age or under and the contestant must not be entered in any other class which would require a gate faster than a trot.

Additional Youth Awards

All-Around and Reserve 13 and Under Youth, halter and performance points will be counted.

All-Around and Reserve 14-18 Youth, halter and performance points will be counted.

All-Around and Reserve Novice Youth, novice youth performance points will be counted.

Presentation of Year-end Awards

Class awards will be presented at the Annual meeting of the NDQHA. Winners should make an effort to pick up their awards at that time or arrange for someone else to do it for them. Awards will not be mailed out. Awards not claimed by October of the following year will be recycled.

Preceding NDQHA Show Rules were adopted by the NDQHA Board of Directors, January 16, 1993.

NDQHA SHOW APPROVAL

1. All shows requesting approval of NDQHA must, also, be AQHA approved.
2. Application for NDQHA approval will be made by submitting a complete show schedule to the NDQHA secretary 90 days prior to the show date, accompanied by the show approval fee of \$75.00.
3. The show approval fee will cover the cost of advertising the show in the Newsletter and printing of the show results.
4. The show schedule must include a list of all classes, entry fees, location of the show, the judges, and any applicable restrictions or qualifications.
5. The official results of the show must be sent to the NDQHA point secretary within 14 days after the show date in the form of copies of each AQHA class sheet.
