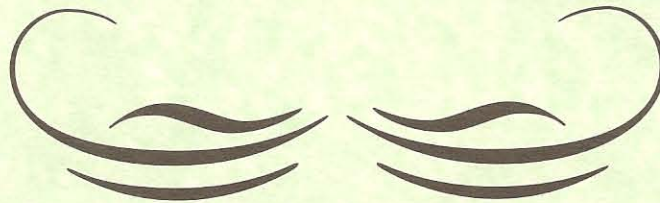

# LETTER FROM THE NDQHA PRESIDENT

As the new year quickly approaches, it is a reminder to me of those people who helped make North Dakota sponsored shows so successful. I would like to take this time to thank NDQHA's members, show management, show secretaries, ring stewards, gate persons, announcers, AQHA judges, directors, and other personnel who were instrumental in making 1995 a great year for NDQHA.

This is my last letter as the NDQHA President. As you may know, I have been a Board of Director for three years, and have served as NDQHA President for the past two years. It has been my choice to not run for another three year term. I have noticed one overall factor over the past three years, and that is that NDQHA has many wonderful members who are wanting to help support our organization.

There has always been a helping hand out there by the members. This is people interested in supporting the one common bond to this organization, the American Quarter Horse. Let's all remember that this is why we become involved at whatever level in this organization. The American Quarter Horse has been the driving force for many of us, and I cherish the friendships that have been fostered during my past ten years of involvement with NDQHA.

When I was first elected to the NDQHA Board, in 1992, it was agreed that NDQHA needed an image to promote our associations. I designed and donated logos for NDQHA, NDAQHA, and NDYQHA, to provide an image of what North Dakota's associations were about. NDQHA's sponsored shows also needed an incentive for contestants to attend NDQHA's shows. I helped organized bronze trophies and monogrammed halters as awards for circuit winners.

In January of 1994, when I was elected President, I had the first taste of the responsibility needed in presiding over an association. I called individuals in a 6 state area to hire certified AQHA Show Managers and Secretaries for NDQHA's sponsored shows. It was critical that

management was hired, otherwise NDQHA would not have had their sponsored shows in 1994. Thank goodness things fell into place and we found hired staff who were able to work our sponsored shows.


I also drew up job descriptions and negotiated wage contracts that would work within the financial constraints of NDQHA's budget. Keeping expenses within a budget was a major concern to secure NDQHA's future. We had key NDQHA members volunteer their time as ring stewards, points tabulators, futurity secretaries, etc. which helped our association stay within a budget and remain profitable at every show in 1994.

Over the past two years as President, I have had many individuals contact me by phone, in person, or by mail and I have had to preside over many issues that affect our organization. It was a lot of work, but I was pleased to have had the opportunity in serving this organization. I encourage anyone who wants to serve in a NDQHA position to do so.

As for myself, I am currently a Board of Director for the American Quarter Horse Association and am also on the Amateur Committee. In fact, in 1995, AQHA has kept me busy representing their association at the Badlands Circuit Finals Rodeo, attending AQHA's Directors Orientation and Regional Workshop, helping with correspondence to Government Officials, answering many surveys, and promoting AQHA at the AQHA World Championship Show.

Once again, thank you for letting me have this opportunity to serve NDQHA. Thanks to all of the members who have helped me out over the past three years and best wishes for a very happy New Year.

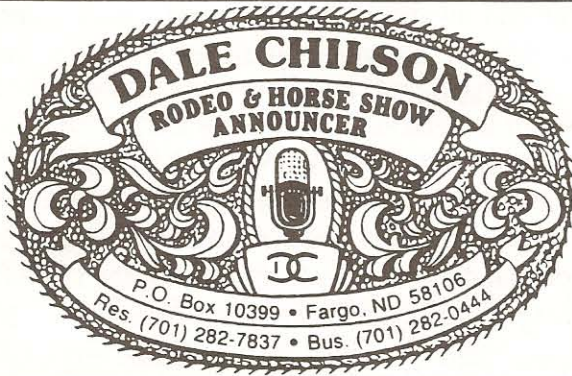

## Minutes of the NDQHA Board of Directors Meeting October 6, 1995 Valley City, ND

The meeting of the Board of Directors was called to order by President Laura Fisher. Board members present were: Laura Fisher, Scott Flach, Kevin Kasprick, Rocky Skarsgard, Kevin Vesey, and Al Rickel.

Minutes from the July 8, 1995 Board of Directors meeting were not read due to the Board previously approving of the minutes so that they could be published in the newsletter which was mailed out before the October 6, meeting.

Discussion was held on 1996 show dates. Laura has been working with Dale Hildebrandt of the North Dakota Winter Show Board, and with AQHA to work out NDQHA Shows for 1996.

Judy Erickson, Jean Frederich, and Janet Striha were contacted by Laura to verify that they will be able and willing to manage the 1996 shows.

Dale Hildebrandt would like to help the NDQHA show season by putting on a second ND Winter Show sponsored show for the Paints and Quarter Horses combined. The date that works out for Dale and his crew is the same weekend as Jamestown has had their show.

Kevin Vesey was elected by the board to talk to the Jamestown show committee and the ND Paint Association to see what will work out.

The 1996 show dates that are proposed are as follows: April 26-28, ND Winter Show; May 25-27, Three Star I; June 7-9, ND Winter Show II (Paint & Quarter); July 5-7, Three Star II; July 18-19, NDAQHA Pre-Show; July 20, ND State Fair; October 4-6, Three Star III.

Kevin Kasprick made a motion that the NDQHA accept the proposed 1996 show dates as reviewed by the Board, pending AQHA and ND Winter Show Board approval. Al Rickel seconded the motion. All approved.

Al Rickel mentioned to the Board that the Bismarck Horse Club would like to know if the NDQHA would be interested in using their facility to put on a horse show since they won't be doing a show anymore. The board unanimously agreed to put that on hold.

Al Rickel updated the Board on the Annual Meeting. The board all unanimously agreed to have the meal a buffet style. As for the entertainment, the board agreed to have Sonya contact Rodney Nelson, a cowboy poet, and Mylo Hautzenbuhler, to get prices and availability of these two and then to contact the board for a decision.

There will be a video of the Fort Worth Junior World Show and the NDQHA team, and there will also be a video about the AQHA shown at the Annual Banquet social hour, or general meeting.

Year end awards were discussed. Scott Flach will fill the awards committee position that became vacant.

Office expenses incurred by NDAQHA and NDQHA were brought up by Sonya. Clarification was needed so that there is an understanding by all whether or not the two offspring associations should be responsible for paying their own expenses. Office expenses including, but not limited to telephone, postage, envelopes, paper, etc.

Kevin Kasprick made a motion that NDQHA will continue to pay the office expenses for the NDAQHA and the NDQHA unless the expenses get high. Scott Flach seconded the motion. All approved.

Discussion was held on sending membership renewal notices to remind those members who have not paid by April 1.



Kevin Vesey made a motion to have one membership renewal reminder in the December issue of the Newsletter, to have a second reminder included in the Annual Banquet information, and a third reminder in the Directory. Al Rickel seconded the motion. All approved.

Discussion was held on the NDQHA phone card. Sonya stated that it is quite expensive because of the automatic surcharge to make a call and then the per minute charge is also quite high.

Scott Flach made a motion that Sonya has approval to simply direct dial calls made for NDQHA business and have NDQHA reimburse her. And that when away from home to use the new MCI card obtained for NDQHA use.

Kevin Kasprick asked that in addition to keeping a photo copy of the bill with the calls and charges on it, that Sonya keep a log of calls specifying who was called and what for.

The NDQHA has received the MBNA America Mastercard for association purchases. The MBNA card is the only card endorsed by the AQHA and provides benefits to over 40,000 AQHA members.

Rocky Skarsgard moved that the NDQHA keep the MBNA card for now, but because of the \$40 annual fee, Sonya continue to search for a business card with a cheaper fee. Al Rickel seconded the motion. All approved.

Scott Flach spoke on the youth committee. He would like to generate a letter this winter to be mailed out to the youth in North Dakota inviting them to show at one NDQHA sponsored show for free. Scott Flach and Kevin Vesey will contact ND 4-H leaders and work with Nora Kane and Shirley Rickel to work out the details on letting the ND youth show for free for a weekend.

The board unanimously agreed Scott's idea was a good one and that it should be pursued.

Scott also asked that at the Annual Meeting in January the NDQHA Board of Directors set

their meeting dates for the year so that everyone can schedule around the Board meetings and vice versa.

Scott also brought up the idea that the NDQHA could think of doing a meeting by teleconference if a quorum is not present or it is inconvenient to get together.

Rocky Skarsgard gave an update on how the futurity is going thus far. He stated there seems to be a misunderstanding amongst show contestants about what is the "corresponding AQHA class" that futurity entrants are to enter. The Board agreed to go ahead with the futurity rules as planned, and that at a later date they would take a look at making changes so that it is less confusing.

Kevin Kasprick moved to adjourn the NDQHA Board of Directors meeting, Rocky Skarsgard seconded the motion. All approved.
